<u>Reading</u> from the Acts of the Apostles:

In the preceding book, Theophilus, I was concerned about everything Jesus did and taught from the beginning, until the day he was taken up, after giving commandments through the Holy Spirit to the apostles he had chosen. To them also he showed himself alive after his passion by many proofs, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about God's kingdom. And while eating with them, he told them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait for the Father's promise," of which you have heard," he said, "by my mouth. For while John baptized with water, you shall be baptized in the Holy Spirit within a few days."

Now those gathered there questioned him, asking," Lord, is it now that you will restore the kingdom to Israel?"
