<u>First day of the Great Fast</u> begins on Monday, February 16, 2015. Strict fast and abstinence required. No meat or dairy products. Is there a Pre-Lenten period that should prepare us for the Great Lent? The pre-Lenten period includes the 4 Sundays prior to Lent. The Sunday gospel messages during this period are designed to prepare us for Lent.

- <u>Sorokousty:</u> the service that honors the deceased and is offered during Lent. Please begin to prepare the list of names of those people whom you wish to remember. The first Sorokousty service will be held on Friday, February 20, 2015.
- <u>Confession</u>: starting Saturday, February 21, 2015 and for the duration of Lent you
 may have the opportunity to have the Sacrament of Confession. Confessions will
 be heard one hour before the Divine Liturgy on Saturday or Sunday.

How do we receive Confession? There are 5 things we need to do to receive absolution of our sins:

- 1. We must think of our sins. This involves an examination of ourselves. It takes time and effort. We want to see ourselves, not as we appear to others, but as we truly are, and as God sees us.
- 2. We must be sorry for our sins. This is contrition. It means to wish we had not done these sins.
- 3. We must confess the sins, that is, tell them during the sacrament, and we are to confess them all.
- 4. We are to arouse a purpose of amendment. This involves a desire and promise not to sin again.
- 5. We do a penance the priest imposes on us during the Sacrament. This is not to make right the wrong. This can never be done by us. But penance serves to aid us in the falling into sins again, and reflects our deep gratitude for God's love.

The doors for forgiveness are always open. We need to come home to Christ and let Him embrace us with His outstretched arms.
