No Kneeling

Please remember, according to tradition there is no kneeling at any time from Pascha to Pentecost Sunday. In the Eastern Catholic Tradition, the action of kneeling and prostrating is a penitential posture. It is the position of a sinner seeking forgiveness. Standing (the proper position of adoration in the East), on the other hand, is the position of giving praise and thanks to God in the spirit of joy and happiness. During the Pashal Season (Easter to Pentecost), the time for repentance and fasting is over. It is time of our salvation for "Christ is Risen".
