The dedication ceremony will take place on Saturday, Nov. 7th at 2:00PM. Our Patriarch Sviatoslav Shevchuk will celebrate the Hierarchical Divine Liturgy on Sunday, November 8th at the Ukrainian Catholic National Shrine to the Holy Family at 9:30AM. A concert and closing ceremony will be held Sunday at 2:00PM. There will be a bus leaving from St. Demetrius Ukrainian Orthodox Cathedral, 645 Roosevelt Avenue, Carteret on Saturday, Nov. 7th at 7:00AM and returning at 6:00PM.
