The church stairs were repointed and steamed cleaned, the church ceiling was repaired and painted, the church basement window was repaired, an area of the driveway was repaired, a new sump pump was installed in the rectory, the main sewer line was cleared out in the rectory, plywood and insulation was installed in the rectory attic, baseboard heating was added to one room in the rectory, a bush and roots removed from side of church and grass seed was put down. The church paid only for the cost of the materials. All labor was donated by Father Vasyl and his family, saving the church thousands of dollars.
